Brisbane Valley Rail Trail

The longest rail trail in Australia, the Brisbane Valley Rail Trail (BVRT) is 161km in length, running from Yarraman in the North to Wulkuraka in the South.

The adventure trail winds its way up the Brisbane valley, uncovering a new experience around each bend. With breathtaking landscapes, open forests, unique country towns and local attractions awaiting to be discovered. Being on the old railway line, the BVRT can be accessed by horse, bike or on foot. Suitable for day trippers, overnight camping or longer term adventures.



Benarkin State Forest

Take a scenic forest drive to picnic, camp, ride or walk under towering forest trees or spot platypus in the local creek.

Located on the Blackbutt Range the Benarkin State Forest is a great spot to explore the natural rainforest, hoop pine plantations and eucalypt forests.

The site has great facilities for bush camping including flushing toilets and cold showers. Spend the night at one of two large campgrounds perfect for tent and trailer based camping.
